Intro:

- A. Big human questions; different "worldview" answers.
- B. **Colossians 2:8** "See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ." (ESV)
- C. If you ever walk away from Christ and the church, where are you going to go, and what are you going to get?

I. Secular Humanism (Optimistic Atheism)

- A. **Emphasis**: No God, but optimistic based on **REASON** and **SCIENCE**.
- B. Symbol: **HAPPY FACE**.
- C. Object illustration: **LEGOS**
- D. Examples: Richard Dawkins; Neil deGrasse Tyson; Bill Nye the science guy.

II. Nihilism (Pessimistic Atheism)

- A. **Emphasis**: No God, and pessimistic nothing matters.
- B. Symbol: **FROWNY FACE**.
- C. Object illustration: **TOILET**.
- D. Examples: Friedrich Nietzsche; "Bohemian Rhapsody"; senseless shootings; some suicides (Kurt Cobain).

III. Existentialism

- A. **Emphasis**: No God, but optimistic based on **FEELINGS** and **FREEDOM**.
- B. Define yourself (Jean-Paul Sartre).
- C. Symbol: **FROWNY** AND **SMILEY FACE**.
- D. Object Illustration: MR. POTATO HEAD.
- E. Examples: Jean-Paul Sartre; Albert Camus; many teenagers.

IV. Postmodernism

- A. **Emphasis**: Truth totally depends on your **PERSPECTIVE**.
- B. Symbol: **TWO FACES** looking at each other.
- C. Object Illustration: **SUNGLASSES**.
- D. Examples: Jean-Francois Lyotard; Matrix movies; Inception; WandaVision.

V. Deism

- A. **Emphasis**: God creates but **DOES NOTHING** within the world.
- B. Symbol: **CLOSED Box** around a circle.
- C. Object Illustration: **GRANDFATHER CLOCK**.
- D. Examples: Thomas Jefferson; William Paine; American teens and their "moral therapeutic deism" (see Christian Smith, Soul Searching: The Religious and Spiritual Lives of American Teenagers).

VI. New Age Pantheism

- A. **Emphasis**: Experience **ONENESS** with the universe (= God).
- B. Symbol: CIRCLE in triangle.
- C. Object Illustration: YIN YANG.
- D. Examples: Hinduism, Buddhism, Wicca, Star Wars; Deepak Chopra; *Lion King*; use of crystals, chants, yoga, and meditation.

VII. Biblical Christianity

- A. Emphasis: CSI: Personal CREATOR, loving SAVIOR, INCARNATE God.
- B. Symbol: TRIANGLE PENETRATING CIRCLE.
- C. Object Illustration: **HEART**.
- D. Biblical Christianity: Historic teachings of "THE faith" (Jude 1:3; 2 Cor. 13:5; Col. 1:15-23; 2:7; 1 Tim. 1:18-20; 4:1-2; 6:12, 20-21)
- E. **VS. "Progressive Christianity"**: Reinterpret Scripture to adapt to modern beliefs and values. Warnings against: Matt. 7:15; 24:11; 2 Peter 2:1-2; Jude 1:4.
