- C. An important argument for God (see William Lane Craig: www.reasonablefaith.org).
 - I. Whatever begins to exist must have a cause.
 - 2. The universe began to exist.

Stephen Hawking (atheist): "Bodies such as stars or black holes cannot just appear out of nothing. But a whole universe can.... Because there is a law like gravity, the universe can and will create itself from nothing" (The Grand Design, 180; emphasis added).

Alex Rosenberg (atheist): "Why is there a universe at all? No reason at all. Why is there a multiverse in which universes pop into existence for no reason at all? No reason at all! (Alex Rosenberg, The Atheist's Guide to Reality: Enjoying Life without Illusions, Kindle, pp. 38-39).

Fred Hoyle (non-creationist): "A common sense interpretation of the facts suggests that a superintellect has monkeyed with physics, as well as with chemistry and biology, and there are no blind forces worth speaking about in nature" (emphasis added).

Bill Gates (co-founder of Microsoft): "DNA is like a computer program but far, far more advanced than any software ever created."

Francis Crick (atheist and co-discoverer of DNA): "An honest man, armed with all the knowledge available to us now, could only state that in some sense . . . [the origin of life] is 'almost a miracle."

Antony Flew (at age of 81 converted from atheism to theism): "I think the most impressive arguments for God's existence are those that are supported by recent scientific discoveries.... I now believe that the universe was brought into existence by an infinite Intelligence." (There is a God: How the World's Most Notorious Atheist Changed His Mind, p. 88).
