Note: You may not have time to discuss all of these questions, so feel free to select ones that seem most significant or relevant for your group.

1. This lesson offered some perceptions of truth by Isaiah and Jeremiah and in American culture. What is *your* perception of *truth* in our culture? Where is truth threatened or compromised? Where, if anywhere, do you see truth standing strong?
2. What did you learn or learn more about in this lesson? What Scripture(s) seem most impactful on you? Why?
3. This lesson covered five basic statements that are part of the CORE of Christian truth. Which one of these seems most spiritually significant or relevant to you *personally*? Why? Would you add any other beliefs that should be part of the core of Christian belief? If so, what?
4. 1 Peter 3:15 says we should always be prepared to “make a defense” or give a reasoned answer (*apologia*) for the hope we have as Christians. Currently, how well do you think you can do that? In what areas or topics do you believe you need more help in being better prepared?
5. The lesson concluded with three points for instruction and encouragement. What were these? Which one is the most relevant or the most encouraging to you? Why?
6. What questions or other comments do you have about this lesson?
